In this colloquium the mathematics education faculty at MSU shares their experience learning and working together to grow their capacity to speak and write on issues of injustices and inequities in their work as mathematics educators and within their field. The showpiece for this presentation is their latest book: "Cases for mathematics educators: Facilitating Conversations about Inequities in Mathematics Classrooms" a co-edited volume of 19 cases with commentaries where each of the MSU mathematics education faculty has authored a case or commentary. This book represents the dialogue that began years earlier at a conference this faculty hosted focused on developing our capacities to learn, speak and write about issues of privilege and oppression within the field. Each of the presenters will read an excerpt of their case or commentary and share what they learned from this experience and their perspectives on challenges and rewards of engaging in this kind of collaborative scholarship.
